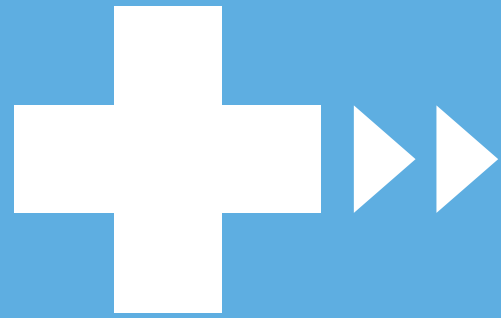

ABOUT THE PROGRAM



For NAMDRC's 35th Annual Meeting and Educational Conference we travel back to California Wine Country to The Fairmont Sonoma Mission Inn and Spa, 100 Boyes Blvd., Sonoma, CA.

The 2012 program is entitled, "Cutting Edge Science: Practical Applications for Your Pulmonary Practice." It is designed to provide meeting registrants with a broad cross section of clinical information that should serve as an excellent educational opportunity. The content will include cutting edge technology and timely information regarding pulmonary hypertension; interstitial lung disease centering on sarcoidosis; the future of sleep medicine; perspectives of national health policy and its impact on pulmonary medicine; new science in early detection and treatment of lung cancer; long term ventilation; pulmonary rehabilitation and evidenced based outcomes; hospital safety and quality assessment components; standard of medical care for futile and non-beneficial treatment as well as a targeted range of management and practice issues.

Planning Your Trip

Getting There

The Fairmont Sonoma Mission Inn and Spa is located approximately 60 miles north of San Francisco. Travel from the San Francisco International Airport via the Golden Gate Bridge is approximately 90 minutes. You can also use the Oakland or Sacramento International Airports to reach the Fairmont.

Ground Transportation

Parking

The Fairmont Sonoma Inn has a two level parking garage opposite the front of the inn. Level two is for self-parking while the lower level is for valet parking.
